Information/Timely Reminders

Uniforms – Prep children wear their sports uniform every day. Children in Years 1-6 have alternative days for Formal and Sports uniforms.

Monday: Formal school uniform for Years 1-6.

Tuesday: Year 1 & 2 Sports uniform. Years 3-6 Formal uniform.

Wednesday: Year 1 & 2 Formal uniform. Years 3-6 Sports uniform.

Thursday: Formal school uniform for Years 1-6.

Friday: Sports uniform for all students.

Before School – For the safety of your child/ren parents are asked not to bring children to school before 8am. From 8am, children arriving at school are to sit with their bags and wait quietly in the undercover area until a teacher comes onto duty at 8:15am. With the teacher on duty the children are allowed to move to play on the senior oval until the school bell (music) plays at 8:30am. After School - Parents are welcome to wait for their children in the undercover area or the MacKillop Prayer Space area outside the Learning Hub in the afternoons. We do ask that parents do not wait just outside classrooms as this can disrupt the class when they are undertaking their end of day learning and routines. Teachers will dismiss the children, who will make their way out to the pickup areas. A teacher is on duty at the front pickup area until 3:20pm, at which time any children who are still waiting to be picked up will be taken to sit in the Office. As St Joseph's operates an After School Hours program children are not allowed to play in the undercover area or on any playgrounds after school.

Update to Device Safety and Security

In line with St Joseph's technology vision, schoolowned devices enhance the quality of teaching and learning. Ensuring student safety and security online is a top priority. The school is transitioning to the use of the ZScaler Client Connector (ZCC), which will enhance the existing safety and security protocols for devices used off-site, providing the same protection as when students are on site at school. There are two significant benefits to transitioning to the ZScaler Client Connector:

1. Firewall Protection (Security) - All network traffic is transmitted via the Catholic Education -Diocese of Rockhampton's (CEDR) secure firewalls. The program detects and prevents many internet-based malicious software, including viruses, ransomware, and other dangers.

2. Web Content Filter (Safety) - The same web browsing rules defined at the school take effect 'off network'. This includes at home, phone hotspots, public Wi-Fi, and libraries, providing more assurance of student internet browsing. These filters also enable access restrictions to Social Media accounts on school-owned devices.

Please be aware that, in line with Student Protection measures, the school is unable to track the geolocation of student devices or monitor student screens when they are off campus. The transition will occur early in 2025. Students will be asked to log in once to the ZScaler Client Connector to commence its use. Students are unable to log out of, or disable, the program.

Implementing these measures helps to create a secure and supportive learning environment, both online and offline. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me to discuss.

Welcome to the Learning Hub for 2025!

When is the Learning Hub open?

The Learning hub will be open Tuesday to Thursday mornings from 8.15am -8.30am for reading and homework catch up. We would really love to see the older students bringing a younger student in, to read to them! The Learning hub is open for playtime Tuesday to Thursday, during this time there are board games to play, colouring in, reading and there is a quiet space for homework catch up as well.

What day does my child's class come to the Learning Hub?

If your child misses their borrowing day or are ready for some different books, they can always come before school or during playtime Tuesday to Thursday.

What does my child need to bring to the Learning Hub?

Each class attends the Learning hub once a week. During this time, they can borrow 2 books for home, the younger grades also will borrow home readers for the week. The books are loaned to the children for a 2-week period, no need to return them if you did not get to finish them. Overdue notices will be sent home during week five, seven and nine.

Prep to Year three are to have all books returned to the library by week nine of the term, year four to six can borrow books over the holiday period.

Your child must have a **waterproof library bag** to be able to borrow books to take home.

Damaged or lost books.

If you come across a tear in the book or loose pages, please do not try to repair the book, send it back to the learning hub and we will repair it with our book friendly tape. Our books do get a lot of use, so this does happen time to time.

I fully understand that books do go missing! Please do not be afraid to let me know that this has happened, often they do turn up when we are at least expecting to find them. This way we can ensure that your child still gets to borrow and keep working on their reading stamina.

Book Club.

Once a term we will have book club. This year, book club have made it a lot easier for us. Each class is now just given one catalogue. Once you decide if you are going to purchase from book

club, fill in the form and return it to school with the correct money. Credit card payment is also an option, but this is done online. If you do this you do not need to send anything back to school, I am sent a list of orders. Here is a list of the classes as they appear on Loop.
