

### Principal's Pen - Monica White


It is with deep sorrow that we join the global Catholic community in mourning the passing of our Holy Father, Pope Francis. A shepherd of compassion, humility, and unwavering faith, Pope Francis touched the hearts of millions with his message of mercy, care for our common home, inclusion, care for the most vulnerable among us and his firm and unconditional "no" to war. Pope Francis has been our Pope since 2013 and for these past twelve years has gently and compassionately led our Church.

Pope Francis was born Jorge Mario Bergoglio on 17 December 1936 in Buenos Aires, Argentina. He was ordained a priest in 1969; from 1973 to1979 he was the Jesuit provincial superior in Argentina. He became the Archbishop of Buenos Aires in 1998 and was created a Cardinal in 2001 by Pope John Paul II. He was elected Pope on 13 March 2013 and chose Francis as his papal name in honour of Saint Francis of Assisi. Pope Francis was a man of many firsts – he was the first non-European pope in centuries, the first Latin American pope, the first Jesuit pope and the first to take the name Francis. He will be remembered as a man of simplicity, humility and compassion.

Pope Francis died on Easter Monday 2025, having dedicated his entire life to the service of the Lord. At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, we give thanks for his extraordinary leadership and example of Christ's love in action.

#### Easter

Easter is the celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead. It is celebrated on Sunday, and marks the end of Holy Week, the end of Lent, the last day of the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday), and is the beginning of the Easter season of the liturgical year.

As we know from the Gospels, Jesus Christ rose from the dead on the third day following his crucifixion, which would be Sunday. His resurrection marks the triumph of good over evil, sin and death. It is the singular event which proves that those who trust in God and accept Christ will be raised from the dead.

Since Easter represents the fulfillment of God's promises to mankind, it is the most important holiday on the Christian calendar. The Easter season lasts for 50 days and ends with Pentecost Sunday.



Every day at St Joseph's we endeavour to be a positive and generous community that reflects God's message of love.






# School Fees Explained

How is Education funded in Australia? The Federal Government "School Resource Standard (SRS)" funding model determines State and Federal Government funding to all schools in Australia.

- For Non-Government schools, the SRS model also identifies each School community's means-tested "Capacity to Contribute (CTC)" through School Fees.
- Unlike many Non-Government schools, Catholic Education -Diocese of Rockhampton (CEDR) schools minimise School fees by delivering education to students within the SRS.

### How are School fees presented in CEDR schools?

School fees are presented as one **All-Inclusive Education fee**, that delivers the curriculum offering of the School, rather than a tuition fee PLUS several School-based levies and charges.
