Greetings to our Families,

Anointing Mass

This last semester, Year Six students have regularly attended the parish Anointing Mass. An Anointing Mass is a special Mass that involves anointing the elderly or sick members of the community with oils.

The Year Six students are invited to sit with a specific member of the community and to place their hand on their shoulder as they are anointed by the priest. Students were a little hesitant at first but have since embraced their roles and usually look forward to this act of mercy. They also enjoy helping the CWA to serve morning tea to the elderly!

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament for those whose are unwell or experiencing ill health. The sacrament enables the sick or aged person to be anointed with the Oil of the Sick, to experience the healing and strength of Jesus Christ and to be supported by a praying community.

The sacrament may be celebrated during Mass, or at a hospital or nursing home, or in a person's home. It is a celebration where members of the Church community offer the support of faith and prayer to those who are sick.

Professor Dawn Adams is the Director of the Autism Centre of Excellence, Griffith University. She is also a Clinical Psychologist and uses both her clinical and research experience to inform a program of research in the area of anxiety, mental health, and wellbeing in autistic individuals.

Navigating School Reports:

Celebrating Your Child's Learning Journey

Times have changed and so has the way we educate and assess children in schools. The days of uniform rows, and chalkboards are giving way to interactive classrooms, technology-driven learning, and a more holistic approach to evaluating student progress. One of the biggest shifts has been in how we interpret report cards especially the meaning of a "C" grade.

For many parents, a "C" may have once carried a negative connotation. However, receiving a "C" means that your child is exactly where they should be for their age and year level. This achievement is not something to overlook—it reflects their dedication and effort in meeting curriculum expectations. It takes consistent work, engagement, and persistence to reach this standard, and your child should be proud of their progress.

As we approach the release of Semester One reports, teachers have been diligently assessing students, reviewing their learning growth, and ensuring their achievements are accurately reflected. This process is not a simple tally of marks—it involves observing development, collecting data, and considering the long-term learning trajectory of each child. These reports provide valuable insights into how your child is progressing and where they may need further support.

It's important to remember that education is a journey, not a destination. Reports are just a snapshot of the learning process, and there's still plenty of time for growth, discovery, and success. We encourage you to celebrate your child's accomplishments, no matter the achievement mark, and to continue supporting them in their learning journey.

If you have any questions about your child's progress, please don't hesitate to reach out to their teacher. Open communication and collaboration between parents and educators create the best environment for learning and success.


