Interschool Sport

Reader's Cup

Some students from Year Five and Six also volunteered to represent our school in the Reader's Cup Challenge. This involved the students in reading several books and being prepared to answer questions about them. They travelled to Harvey Bay to compete against other students from the district. During the competition, a number of questions were answered, debated and considered, with points awarded for accuracy of answers. Mrs Roelofs and Mrs Lankowski helped to support and work with these students to prepare them for the competition. Thank you to these teachers for your time and commitment to supporting our students.

Kids in Space Project

Students in Year Four and Five have also been participating in mixed teams to complete some STEM challenges. STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. This project was focused on the students working together as a team to create a solution around living in space. The teams had to select a challenge, use software to create a 3D printed item that could be used in space. Teams had to create a display and be able to describe and justify their choices.





On Tuesday two teams were selected to travel to Gympie to share their display with the Kids in Space Project officials and to be judged on their efforts. We wait patiently for the outcome. Thank you to Mrs Robinson and Mr Killeen for their enthusiasm and supervision of the children involved. We also thank Mr Killeen and Mrs Cooper for travelling with the students to allow them to enter their work in Gympie.

Questacon



Our school was also visited by the Questacon Science Circus in week eight. This is provided in conjunction with the Australian Government and the National Science and Technology Centre. The experience is designed to stimulate and challenge students to explore science and technology for themselves.

Taiko Drumming Workshop

Our school also hosted a Taiko Drumming workshop where the students were introduced to this traditional Japanese art. From the sound of the “thunder” coming from our hall, it must have been good fun!

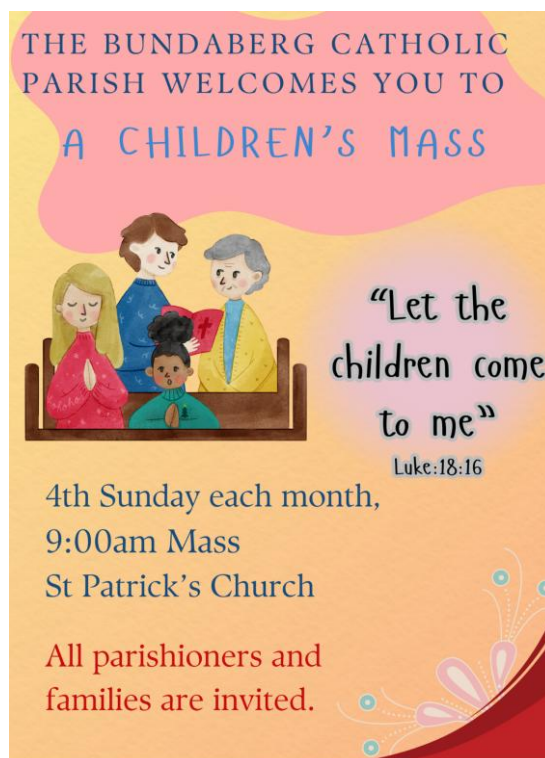

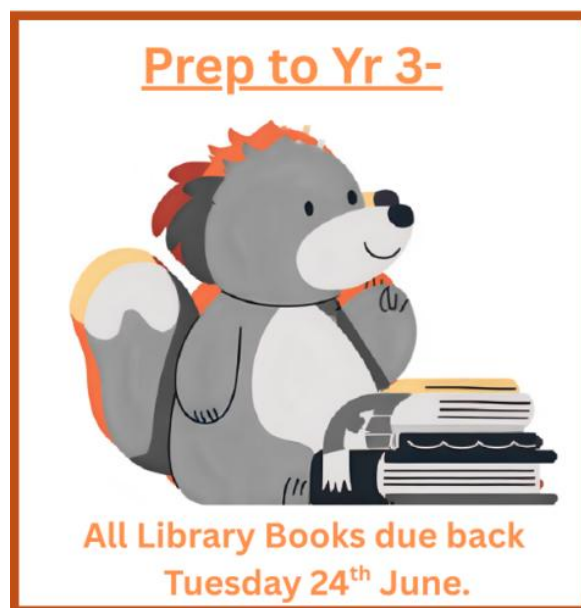

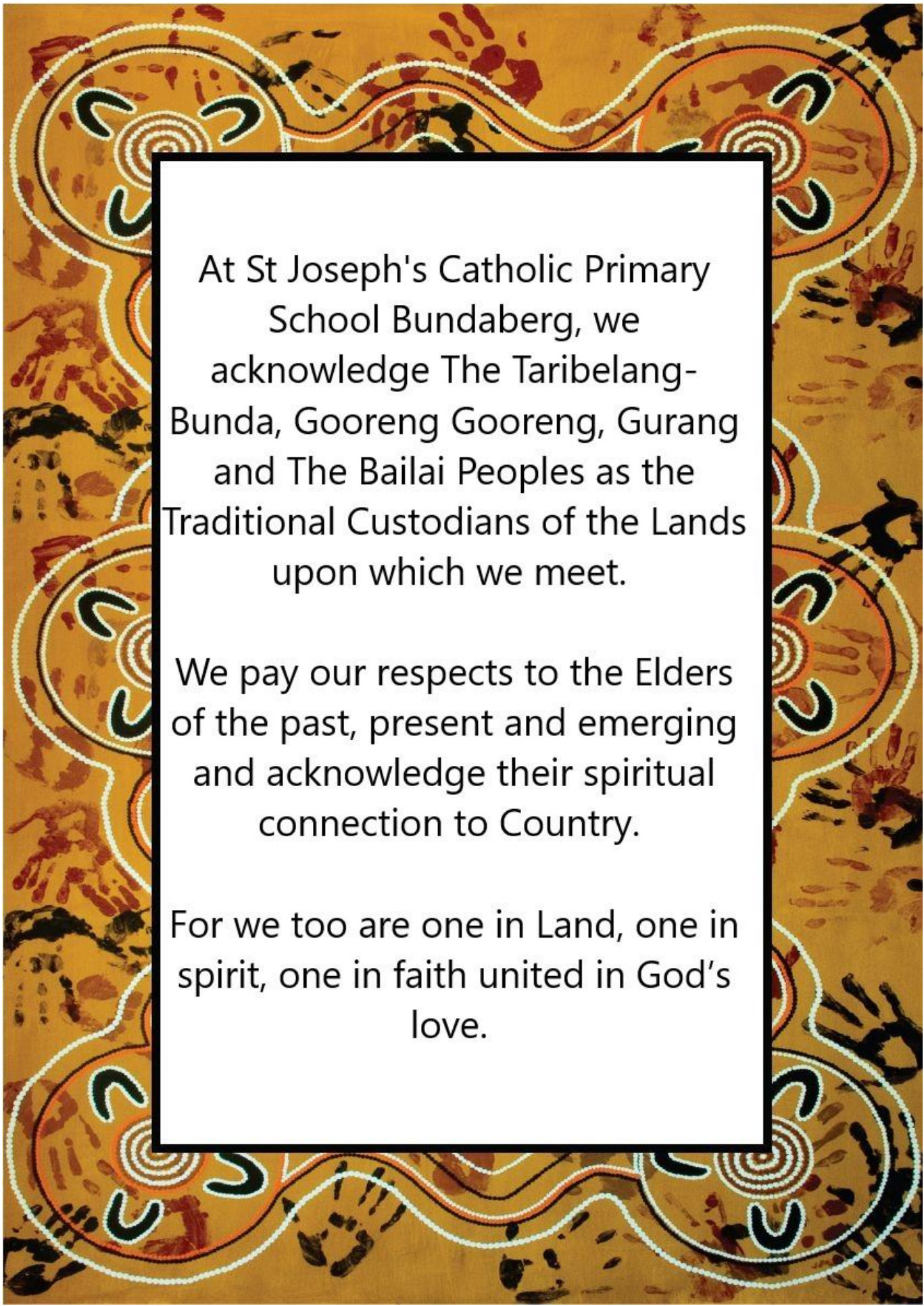
