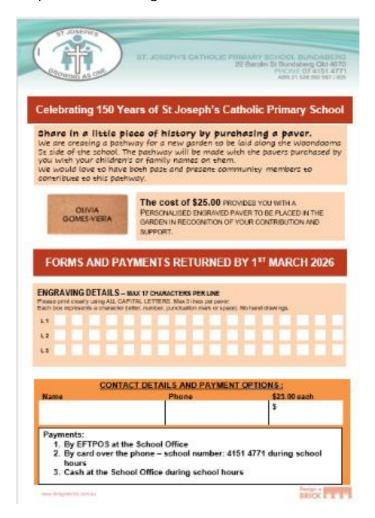

Curriculum Corner – Emma Robinson



Our students inhabit a digital landscape where devices, apps and online communities shape how they learn, socialise and play. Ensuring every child knows how to navigate this space safely is a shared priority for our school community.

Understanding Online Risks

Children can face a range of challenges online, including:

- Exposure to harmful or age-inappropriate content
- Cyberbullying and social pressure
- Privacy breaches and oversharing personal information
- Online scams, grooming and identity theft

Awareness of these risks helps students make smarter choices and builds resilience against digital harms.

School's Safety Measures

To keep our students, secure when online, we:

- Provide a filtered and monitored network across the school
- Embed digital citizenship and online safety lessons into the curriculum
- Train staff to recognise and respond to emerging online safety concerns
- Communicate with parents with regarding online safety concerns
- Maintain clear reporting channels for students who feel unsafe or worried

These measures ensure our learning environment stays positive, respectful and protected.

Partnering with Families

Your involvement strengthens our efforts. We recommend you:

- Have regular, open conversations about your child's online activities
- Set clear guidelines for screen time, privacy settings and app usage
- Use parental controls alongside trust and ongoing dialogue
- Model responsible digital behaviour in your own online routines

Working together means children receive consistent messages about safe and respectful technology use.

Discord	Chat servers for gamers and communities; private channels can hide unmoderated or harmful conversations			
Fortnite	Multiplayer shooter with voice chat and in-game purchases; ensure chat restrictions and purchase approvals are set

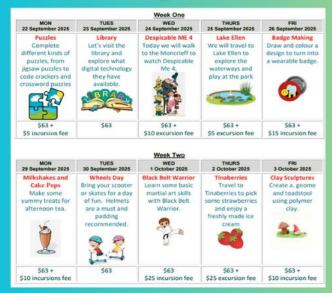
Year 6 - Visit from David Batt

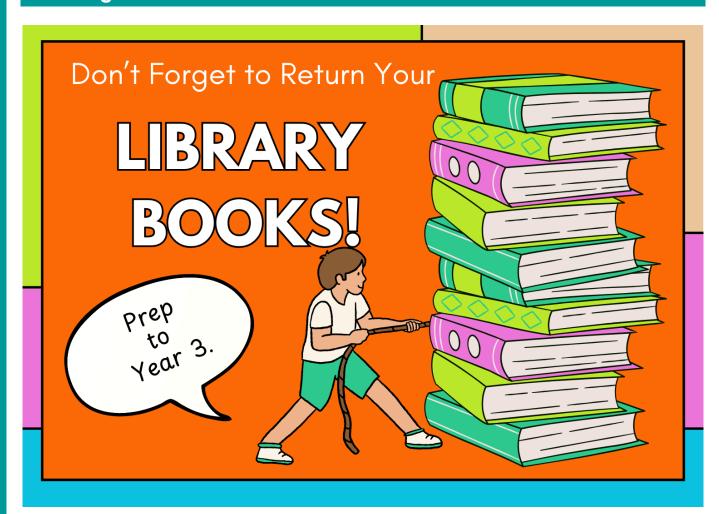

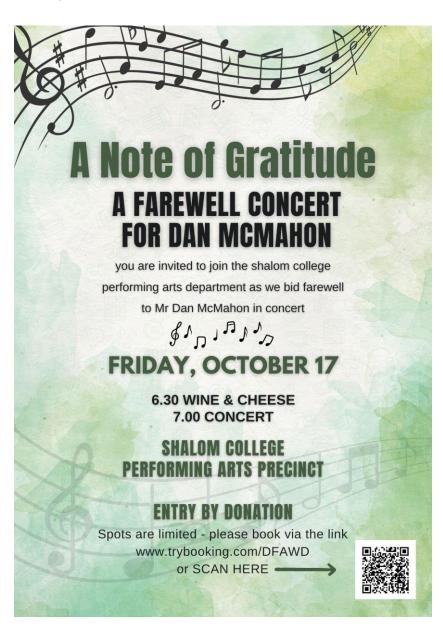
Farewell Concert for Dan McMahon

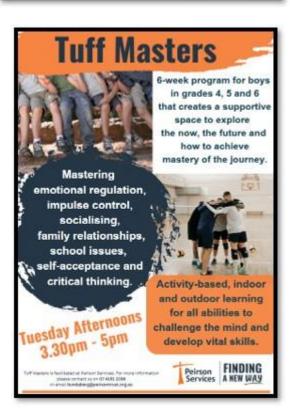
