The 7 Habits of Happy Families

In a recent article for *Happy Families* Dr Justin Coulson shared a handful of powerful habits that parents can practice which make their families happy.

- **1. Assume Positive Intent –** Children are trying their best with limited skills and resources. Sometimes they can be clumsy. They only have their 'L' plates on.
- **2. Laugh Together -** Shared joy creates bonds that withstand life's challenges.
- **3. Fix Things Fast -** Be the first to apologise, especially if you're the parent. Name what went wrong. Take responsibility for your part. Ask what would help. End with physical connection. A hug, high five, or fist bump resets everyone's nervous system.
- 4. Stay Close Children of all ages are biologically wired for connection with their parents.

- 5. Listen Fully Being heard creates security and builds trust.
- 6. Create Meaningful Traditions Family rituals create stability and identity in an unpredictable world.
- 7. Have the Hard Conversations Children need parents who are brave enough to discuss difficult topics.


Catholic Education Week

Curriculum Corner – Emma Robinson

Building Thinking Classrooms in Mathematics

We're excited to share a fresh and inspiring shift happening in our classrooms! For over a year, St Joseph's has been part of the "Leading Mathematics Education Project". A two-year professional learning initiative focused on transforming mathematics teaching and learning. Our teachers have been exploring best practices and high-impact strategies such as growth mindsets, pedagogical focus, and high-leverage teaching practices. We've been diving into a number of leading mathematics education texts—including 4 Steps to the Effective Teaching and Learning of Mathematics with a focus on growth mindset, embedded number talks, building fluency routines, and facilitating mathematical problem solving. Guided by these powerful ideas, our teachers are transforming the way students experience Mathematics—from memorising steps to truly thinking, exploring, pushing their boundaries and collaborating with their peers.

? Why Are We Doing This?

Every learner in every school deserves an outstanding Mathematics education and ongoing opportunities to become a "confident, creative user and communicator of mathematics" (ACARA, 2019). We believe that all students can succeed in math when given the right environment—one that encourages a growth mindset, curiosity, deep thinking, and meaningful engagement.

O What's the Goal?

Our goal is to develop and support high-performance mathematics teachers, leading to outstanding mathematics learning in every classroom across our school. Through targeted professional learning, we're building our teachers' content knowledge, teaching strategies, and leadership skills. Which will lead to high quality mathematical learning for all students in our school.

I Four Steps to Effective Teaching and Learning of Mathematics

To support this transformation, we're focusing on four foundational practices that help all students thrive in Mathematics:

Fostering a Growth Mindset:

- We help students understand that mathematical ability is not fixed—it grows with effort, persistence, and learning from mistakes.
- Teachers model positive attitudes toward challenge and normalise struggle as part of the learning process.
- This mindset builds resilience and encourages students to take risks and persevere through complex problems.

Embedding Number Talks:

- Short, daily discussions where students mentally solve problems and explain their thinking.
- These talks develop number sense, flexibility with numbers, and confidence in mental computation.
- Students learn to listen to others' strategies, justify their reasoning, and build a deeper understanding of mathematical relationships.

Building Routines for Fluency:

- We incorporate consistent, engaging routines that build fluency with key concepts like addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.
- These routines are not about speed—they're about accuracy, efficiency, and flexibility.

Fluency supports students in tackling more complex problems with confidence and ease.

Facilitating Mathematical Problem Solving:

- Teachers support students through rich, open-ended problems that require reasoning, collaboration, and creativity.
- Instead of giving answers, teachers ask questions that prompt deeper thinking and exploration.
- This approach helps students develop critical problem-solving skills and see themselves as capable mathematicians.

🐥 What This Means for Your Child

You might notice your child talking more about math, feeling more confident, or even saying it's fun! That's because they're not just learning math—they're doing math. They're thinking, collaborating, and discovering new ways to approach challenges.

We're proud of the growth we're seeing already, and we're just getting started. As we continue to build thinking classrooms and grow our team of expert math educators, we'll keep you updated on the journey and we welcome your support and curiosity along the way.

A school fee payment was received on Monday, 9 June, via Westpac Bank, but it did not include a student name or identifying reference.


If you believe this payment may have been yours, please contact the school office as soon as possible. Proof of deposit will be required to verify the transaction and allocate the funds correctly.


